3.07 Prepaid Expenses Reporting Package

Overview

- ▶ Prepaid expenses are expenditures for goods or services that were paid for in advance of the corresponding usage period.
 - ▶ Example: An agency purchases a two-year insurance policy on January 1, 2024. At the date of purchase, the entire amount paid is a prepaid expense. The prepaid expense balance decreases throughout the policy period until the policy ends on December 31, 2025, at which point the prepaid expense balance is zero.
- ► Prepaid expenses are assets that are reported on the Statement of Net Position or Balance Sheet.
- ► State agencies generally function on a cash basis throughout the fiscal year. Most reporting packages are completed to convert year-end activity from a cash basis to an accrual basis.

Prepaid Expenses During the Fiscal Year

- ► To ensure accurate reporting, agencies should track prepaid expenses throughout the fiscal year.
- ► The most common method for doing this is by adding "PREPAID", "PREPAID", or some other variation of those in the header text field and/or the item text field when processing invoices in SCEIS.
 - ► After year end, we send out two Business Warehouse reports:
 - ► Yearend Rptg Prepaid Expenses (header text)
 - ► Yearend Rptg Prepaid Expenses Item Text (item text)
 - ► These reports are only a starting point. Agencies must review internal records and/or invoices to determine what amounts should be reported and how those amounts should be classified (current vs. noncurrent).
- Some agencies may also track their prepaid expenses in a spreadsheet throughout the year, which can save time later.

What should be reported at year end?

- ► Expenditures for goods or services that were paid for in the current fiscal year but whose usage period extends beyond June 30 of the current fiscal year except:
 - ▶ Payments made in advance for debt, lease assets capitalized in accordance with GASB 87, or SBITAs capitalized in accordance with GASB 96.
- ► Any lease or software agreement payments made in advance for leases or software agreements <u>that are not capitalized</u> should be included.
- Qualifying payments made to private entities and/or other State agencies.

What should be reported at year end? (continued)

- Amounts reported as noncurrent in prior year(s).
 - ► Example: An agency prepaid a five-year service contract on January 1, 2022. The service contract cost \$500,000 and was for the period of January 1, 2022 December 31, 2026. The agency would report the following on their reporting package for each respective fiscal year:

Note: The agency could elect to not report anything related to this item in FY27 (see next slide).

What can be excluded at year end?

- Agencies may exclude items that would have been a prepaid expense at the date of payment but are fully expensed prior to June 30 of the current fiscal year.
- ▶ Agencies may exclude prepaid items individually under \$10,000 (current plus noncurrent) up to \$100,000 in the aggregate. Report any items that are individually \$10,000 or more and, if necessary, smaller items so that the total amount excluded does not exceed \$100,000.
 - ► Example: An agency has 12 prepaid items that are \$9,000 each and a one prepaid item that is \$5,000, which totals to \$113,000. The agency elects to report one of the \$9,000 items and the \$5,000 item, resulting in \$14,000 being reported and \$99,000 being excluded.
- ► Agencies may exclude a prepaid expense if 12 months of expenditures have already been recorded in the current fiscal year for recurring items that have been in existence.
